The regular meeting of Lehighton Borough Council was held in the Municipal Building on Monday, February 24, 2014. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Pres. Grant Hunsicker. ## <u>Guest Speaker: D&L Heritage Corridor - Scott Everett and Elissa Garofalo</u>

Elissa said they are moving forward with the proposed trailhead. There is no money for design to explore options of where to go so she was asking for the borough's help with the alley between Castle Grill and RJ Walker. She would like to close that alley to motorists but not to emergency vehicles and put the handicapped accessible trailhead in behind Castle Grill. This would cause the D&L to encroach on LSA property and leave no room for Castle Grill to expand so she is looking at the alley instead. Elissa just wanted to update council on what was being looked at.

## **HEARING OF PERSONS PRESENT**

Mr. Ryan Saunders of 327 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street thanked council for snow removal. He said a business owner of a hair salon is concerned about the public lot not being plowed. He has clients and employees that utilize the lot and it would be great if it didn't take 6 days to get it plowed. By then the second storm ruined any hope of the lot being cleared. He does understand there is a lot of snow to be cleared but wants council to consider the business owners who are open and need places to park.

Angela Dejesus of 411 Mahoning Street wanted to know why PPL electric rates are two cents less per Kwh. She feels it is a lot for borough residents to pay.

President Hunsicker said we give you street lights at no charge but PPL charges for theirs. We provide traffic signals and have minimal power outages unlike PPL. Ms. Dejesus said but the borough is putting the burden on the renters and not the property owners. It's a different situation. President Hunsicker said all residents use electric and all residents are charged equally because it's the fairest way to spread the cost out and to keep taxes down. The Borough Manager had offered to meet with Ms. DeJesus to discuss the rates and financial structure of the Borough.

Mr. Bruce Morrison of 277 South 1st Street had a question about Temple Alley. The alley is cut downhill and he got stuck at 5:30 a.m. Thursday morning. It took him two hours to dig himself out. Friday he slid into a snow bank going up the cut and damaged his car. This has cost him two days of work. He was told this is a private alley and he does take care of his section but the neighbors do not.

He has been told repeatedly that it is a private alley and the borough does not do anything to it. However, the old timers who live there say the borough used to plow and cinder it. There is still 2" of ice there and he would appreciate the borough doing something. His concern is missing work as he only has so many days off. If the borough would at least take care of the cut he would appreciate it. President Hunsicker said the borough engineer would have to take a look at it and if it is ours we will take care of it. If it isn't then there is nothing we can do as we can't go on private property.

#### Officials Reports

### Borough Manager

We are in the process of receiving the Local Share reimbursement back with the assistance of the treasurer. We have the 90-day temporary occupancy permit for the fire station project. We have one variance into Labor & Industry.

Nicole wanted to make council aware of the cost to the borough for the winter weather and what it cost to maintain our properties and roads. From December until February we have had over 900 hours of overtime equaling over \$30,000 which is over 50% of our budget. We haven't touched that in a year. 225 hours were in the most recent pay. We have over \$25,000 spent in winter maintenance supplies. We have over 20 miles of roadway to maintain, 7 properties, over 2 miles of borough owned sidewalks, 6 parks and 4 public parking lots in addition to our properties.
